Attending and Departure Times Regulations

- School day starts at **07:20 A.M.**
- Dismissal time for the Kindergarten stage is at **01:45 P.M.**
- Dismissal time for the 2nd secondary stage (only) is at **12:15 P.M** for students not using school transportation.
- Preparatory Stage (Boys) students authorized to leave on their own will be dismissed at **2:25 P.M.**
- First Secondary Grade (Boys) students authorized to leave on their own will be dismissed at **2:15 P.M.**
- Preparatory Stage (Girls) students authorized to leave on their own will be dismissed at **2:30 P.M.**
- First Secondary Grade (Girls) students authorized to leave on their own will be dismissed at **2:15 P.M.**
- Dismissal time for the rest of the grades who leave with their parents is at **02:40P.M**
- The student is not allowed to attend school before **07:05A.M**, and the dismissal times mentioned above must be adhered to, as the student will not be allowed to stay at school after **03:30 PM**, and your commitment to these times is appreciated and respected, to ensure the safety of our children, as there will be no supervision before or after these times.
- Please, do not park at places that are not designated for that, and avoid overcrowding in front of the gates for the safety of everyone.
- School Reception and Parents Service Center working hours are from **08:00 AM** till **02:00 PM** sharp. No entry will be allowed except at these times.

Important Notes:

- Two ID Cards will be issued to kindergarteners and 1st primary students. **One of them must be worn daily by the student when attending school, especially on the first day and within the first month of school, as well as during school trips.** As for the other ID Card, it is for the non-bus subscribers, and it must be shown daily by the adult who picks up the child from school throughout the school year, knowing that children are not allowed to be handed over to their siblings at school except to those who are in the preparatory stage and up, and showing the ID Card is also a MUST. As for the second primary students, they will receive only an ID Card to be used for picking them up under the same conditions.
- It is not permitted for the student to leave during the school day, except in emergency cases and not on frequent bases, in order to ensure the regularity of the educational process and in implementation with the decisions of the Ministry of Education. Leaving in this case should be maximum at **01:00 PM** and that must be by the presence of the parent/guardian along with having a previous permission from the stage headmaster/mistress.

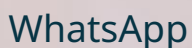

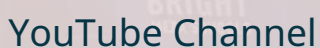

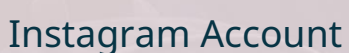
